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Dear Teacher

Thank you for taking part in Humphrey's Helpers – our campaign aimed specifically at primary schools raising money for both Royal Manchester Children's Hospital Charity and your school*. Our hospital mascot, Humphrey, has set children the challenge of collecting as many 5p coins as possible to make a difference to poorly children in hospital.

The support of your class and school really means a lot to us and will make a difference for our patients.

The Humphrey's Helpers challenge focuses on:

- Fundraising for our play therapy services in our hospital
- Understanding the difference children can make to others
- Reaching a goal as an individual and as a group

To help with the challenge, we've suggested various activities that you may wish to use in class.

Literacy

This worksheet has suggested activities for all ages and abilities. If any of your pupils decide to take on the haiku and/or limerick challenges, we'd love to hear about them and maybe put them on our social media channels!

Numeracy

The toy shop activity is to help all pupils understand the difference they are making for our patients (see more about play therapy overleaf). There are three levels of worksheets for different abilities. Pupils are able to complete each worksheet based on their individual total raised and then the cumulative totals for class/year/school where appropriate. This helps to reinforce the difference that teamwork makes.

Numeracy 1 – loosely based on Foundation/Key Stage 1

For this activity, the pupil ticks each and every toy that the total raised can buy.

Numeracy 2 – loosely based on Key Stage 1 and 2

For this activity, the pupil works out how many of each and every toy that the total raised can buy.

Numeracy 3 – loosely based on upper Key Stage 2

For this activity, the pupil works out what combination of toys the total raised can buy.

Other Activities

- Set the haiku or limerick to music and create a dance
- Layout the 5p coins in the shape of Humphrey's head, the letters R, M, C, H or even your school name. This can be done in the playground or school hall if you do undertake this, please take a photo for our social media channels (subject to appropriate consent)
- Set your pupils a creative writing task, which could be to imagine a day in hospital as a patient, nurse or doctor

We know there are hundreds of fundraising opportunities that schools can get involved with, for many different worthy causes, so your support of our Humphrey's Helpers initiative is hugely appreciated!

Therapeutic and Play Services

The play team at Royal Manchester Children's Hospital provides one of the largest and most comprehensive hospital play services in the UK and Europe. The money raised from Humphrey's Helpers supports play therapy in our hospital, providing toys and play equipment for our young patients.

Why is play needed in hospital?

Play is an important part of the medical care we provide for children and young people because it:

- Is a normal part of childhood
- Creates a link between home and hospital this helps children adapt to a strange environment
- Helps children understand and cope with hospital procedures
- Aids the medical assessment of a child which helps towards a speedy recovery
- Helps children cope with pain and work through fear, discomfort, anger and a whole range of emotions

Play specialist staff

Most wards have play specialists or play leaders who are usually available Monday to Friday. Some wards have occasional cover for evenings and weekends.

All play staff are trained childcare practitioners with specialist hospital play qualifications.

How the play specialist helps our patients

Play specialists can help:

- A patient understand their condition and the experience they will have in hospital
- Achieve developmental goals for children of all ages and abilities, catering for individual needs in both group and individual play sessions
- Prepare for individual procedures, such as blood tests, by offering coping strategies and distraction
- Support children referred for needle phobia or difficulty with treatments
- Support families, especially brothers and sisters
- Support children with special needs

Play provision

As well as bringing play to patients in their hospital bed, there is a playroom or area on each ward. The play team ensures that there are age appropriate toys, games and books. Your support will directly help this important work.

Sensory Rooms

These rooms offer children of all ages the opportunity to chill out away from noisy and busy wards. They can help children prepare themselves for operations and other procedures. Play specialists use the rooms to work with children with additional needs as well as those recovering from trauma or surgery.

Activity 4 – Humphrey's Helpers Haiku and Limerick

Are you up to an additional challenge? Can your write a haiku or a limerick about why you are collecting 5p coins? A haiku is a traditional Japanese form of poetry with three lines. The first line has five syllables, the second line seven syllables and the third line five syllables.

A limerick is a short poem which is usually funny, with a very strong rhythm and a particular way of rhyming. In a limerick, lines one, two and five rhyme and lines three and four rhyme.
